

Mr. McLean, presented a memorial of Rachel R. Wagner, of the city of Baltimore, praying indemnity for certain losses occasioned by the riots in that city in 1812;

Also, presented a petition of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, recommending the memorial of Rachel F. Wagner, of said city;

Which were severally read.

Mr. McLean then asked to be excused from serving on the committee.

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said memorial was then referred to Messrs. Crisfield, Duke, Maulsby, Ridgely and Alexander.

Mr. Iglehart, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to record and make valid certain deeds therein mentioned;

Ordered, that Messrs. Iglehart, Culbreth and Ridgely, report the same.

Mr. Brengle, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to amend the constitution and form of government, so far as the same relates to clerks of the county courts, and registers of wills, changing the mode of appointment and limiting their terms of office;

Ordered, that Messrs Brengle, Alexander and McLean, report the same.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Ordered, that the committee on coloured population, be discharged from the further consideration of a leave referred to said committee, to report a bill, entitled, an act to authorise Eleanor R. Contee and Philip A. L. Contee, guardian of Benjamin Contee, of Charles county, to introduce certain slaves for life into this State, and that the same be referred to a select committee.

Whereupon said leave was referred to a select committee composed of Messrs. Hawkins, Tuck and Matthews.

Mr. Keene moved that the house adjourn;

Determined in the negative

Also, reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act therein mentioned;

Mr. Harris reported a bill entitled, an act relating to free negro and mulatto children; and,

Mr. Brengle reported a bill entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government so far as relates to clerks of county courts and registers of wills, changing the mode of appointment, and limiting their terms of office;
