

MONDAY, February 27th, 1837.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Which was read and referred to the committee on agriculture.

Mr. Kershner presented a petition of sundry members of the Evangelical Lutheran Congregation in Hagerstown, in Washington county, praying for an act of incorporation;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Kershner, Rentch and Swingley.

Mr. Carpinter presented a memorial of sundry farmers and planters of Charles county, praying certain improvements in agriculture in this State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on agriculture.
