

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Westren Shore pay to the several members of the Legislature, their clerks and officers, who attended the seat of government in obedience to the Proclamation of the Governor in November last, or to their orders, the several sums of money due them, and for which they obtained certificates from the chairman of the committee on claims of that session,

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and assented to.

Mr. Maulsby, chairman of the committee on insolvency, made a favourable report upon the bill, reported by Mr. Kershner, entitled, an act in favour of John Frame, of Washington county.

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time by special order and passed.

Mr. McLean, presented a memorial of the Farmers and Planters Bank of Baltimore, praying to be released from a certain part of the State bonus for the reasons therein mentioned,

Which was read, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

On motion of Mr McLean,

Ordered, that William Frick, of the city of Baltimore, have leave to withdraw his petition from the files of this house.

Mr. Matthias, reported a bill, entitled, an act to change the name of Ann Isett, of Frederick county, to that of Ann Royer,—And,

Mr. McLean, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill, entitled, an act relating to limited partnerships in this State,

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The hour having arrived for taking up the orders of the day, the house proceeded to consider the bill, entitled, an act to confirm an act, entitled, an act to alter and amend the constitution and form of government of this State, so far as it relates to the representation in the House of Delegates, from the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1835, chapter 98.

Mr. Hemsley, moved to postpone the order of the day until to-morrow,

Resolved in the affirmative.
