

SATURDAY, March 18th, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Brengle,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to limit the time of continuing in office the inspectors and lottery commissioners of this State.

On motion of Mr. Parran,

Said bill was amended by striking out the word 'and,' in the fourth line, and inserting in lieu thereof, the following, 'wood corders in the city of Baltimore and guagers.'

Mr. Gough moved further to amend said bill by striking out in the fifth line thereof 'five' and inserting 'seven,'

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. McLean,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Richardson, entitled, an act in aid of the construction of a State Armory and Town Hall in the city of Baltimore, and the rebuilding and improvement of the Hanover market house in said city.

On motion of Mr. Richardson,

Said bill was amended by filling the blank in the first section, with the names of Charles F. Mayer, Samuel Moore, James L. Ridgely, Arthur Rich, James W. McCulloh, and Edward J. Richardson;

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Ridgely,

The house took up for consideration the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to provide for the inspection and weight of Anthracite or hard coal, and for the measurement of bituminous coal,

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and returned to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Crisfield,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, from the committee on ways and means, entitled, a further supplement to an act for founding an University in the city or precincts of Baltimore, by the name of the University of Maryland, and the amendment reported thereto, to strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert the amendment as offered by him from the committee on the 16th inst.
