Enquiry ordered as to prohibiting the slaves of non residents to go at large in this states, 54.

Petition of Bennet Gough, for permission to sell a slave for a term of years beyond the State, presented and referred ; the reference charged, 61; unfavorable report thereon, 129; concurred in, 134.

Preamble and resolution directing the sum of \$65 paid by Ann Millard, to the clerk of St Mary's county, as a tax for introducing slaves which she had a right by law to introduce, free of such tax, proposed, 71; assented to, 72; sent to the senate, 76; returned passed, 80.

Order to enquire as to the propriety of prohibiting the unlawful assemblages of free negroes or slaves by day or night and also of restraining or prohibiting the circulation or distribution of incendiary handbills or pamphlets, 72.

Petition of Edward Clarke for permission to bring two negro slaves into this State, presented and referred, 77; the committee report that existing laws fully provide for the case, which is concurred in, 110.
