

Mr. Willis presented the petition of C. C. Carman, for relief therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Jenkins,

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal that if Messrs. Billingsley and Jenkins had been in their seats when the vote was taken on the resolutions presented by the Senator from Harford county, requesting the Secretary of War to grant all the facilities in his power to enable the soldiers of this State to return to their places of voting and vote at all elections to be held in this State, they would have voted against the resolutions.

On motion of Mr. Billingsley,

Leave was granted the committee on Finance to report a bill for the relief of St. Mary's Female Seminary.

On motion of Mr. Campbell,

Leave was granted Messrs. Campbell, Bayless and Kemp to report a bill to legalize a bequest made by Jacob Morelock, late of Carroll county, to the trustees of Crider's church, and also a bequest made by George Henry, late of said county, to the trustees of said church.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

Leave was granted the committee on Finance to report a bill entitled, "An Act to amend the Act of 1826, chapter 123, entitled, 'An Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company;'"

Mr. Eichelberger, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill entitled, "An Act to make valid the proceedings in a case numbered 2,391 on the Equity Docket of the Circuit Court of Frederick, wherein Ezra Houck, guardian of Franklin Myers, is complainant, and F. Myers and others are defendants, and also to make valid the deed executed by Ezra Houck, trustee in said cause, to Edward Schley;"
