

WEDNESDAY, March 2, 1864.

Mr. Carroll presented the petition of W. Todd and George Ramly, J. R. Corsey, J. T. Moore, and Robert Keene, praying relief therein mentioned;

Referred to the committee on Finance.

Mr. Ohr submitted the following :

Ordered, That the Senate hereafter hold two sessions daily, commencing at 10½ A. M. and 7½ P. M.

Mr. Willis submitted the following :

“Insert 4½ in lieu of 7½;”

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Crane,

10½ A. M. was stricken out and 11 inserted;

And the order was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Carroll,

Leave was granted Messrs. Carroll, Tome and Purnell to report a bill to allow Alexander Woolford, late sheriff of Dorchester county, further time to complete his collections.

Mr. Bayne, from the committee on Agriculture, to which was referred the Senate bill entitled, “An Act to provide for the weighing and measuring of grain in Baltimore city;”

Reported it without amendment; and,

It was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, “An Act to repeal the 375th and 396th sections of article 4 of Local Law, entitled ‘City of Baltimore,’ and relating to the weighing, inspection and measurement of grain;”

Reported said bill “Ought not to pass;” and

The bill was read the second time, and made the Order of the Day for Friday, the 4th inst.

Mr. Stirling, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the following bills :

A bill entitled, “An Act relating to the redemption of unused Stamps;”

A bill entitled, “An Act confirming the action of the county commissioners of Harford county relating to volunteers;”
