They take pleasure in saying, they commenced their labors by examining Warehouse No. 1. Not finding the Inspector, J. C. Hunt, present, they were under the polite guidance of J. J. Hunt, the chief clerk connected through the building which they found in good condition with the exception of a small portion of the roof where the walls join. The Committee further find that
