

REPORT.

The Joint Committee appointed by the Senate and House of Delegates to examine into and report the present condition of the State Tobacco Warehouses, in Baltimore city, have agreed upon and do make the following Report :

They take pleasure in saying, they commenced their labors by examining Warehouse No. 1 Not finding the Inspector, Jos. R. Hunt, present, they were, under the polite guidance of J. E. Hunt, his chief clerk, conducted through the building, which they found in good condition, with the exception of a small defect in one portion of the roof where the walls join.

Your Committee further find, that :

Your Committee then proceeded to examine Warehouse No. 2, and failing to find the Inspector, Z. Howes, present, they were, under the polite guidance of J. W. Blackburn, his chief clerk, conducted through the building, which they found in ordinary condition. In some portions of the roof there were some leaks which your Committee recommend should be repaired.
