

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough, of Talbot,

Ordered, That the forms prescribed in the joint report of the committee on the part of the Senate, and the committee on the Judiciary on the part of the House, be incorporated as one of the standing rules of this body, and that 300 copies of said rules be printed at once.

The President laid before the Senate the report of the committee on repairs of the public buildings ;

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Kimmel,

The said report was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Mr. McKaig, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported a bill entitled, An act authorizing Edward Long to settle his accounts as guardian of John C. Barkly ;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. McKaig presented the memorial of numerous citizens of Baltimore, remonstrating against the passage of a bill entitled, An act to re-organize the Militia of the State, and in behalf of the Baltimore City Guards.

Also, the memorial of the officers and members of the Baltimore City Guard, against the passage of a bill entitled, An act to re-organize the Militia ;

Which were severally read, and referred to the Committee on Militia.

Mr. McKaig, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported a bill entitled, An act to amend the act of 1826, ch. 123, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road ;

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

Ordered, That five hundred copies of the memorials this day presented, on the subject of the organization of the military of Baltimore, be printed for the use of the Senate, omitting the names of the petitioners.

On motion of Mr. Stone,

Ordered, That one hundred copies of the form for drawing bills be printed for the use of the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Franklin,

Ordered, That all public bills originating in the Senate, after their first reading, be printed and placed on the desk of every Senator.
