

David Clark received 41 votes ;  
John W. Jacobs received 1 vote ;  
E. H. Jones received 4 votes ;  
Thomas Miller received 3 votes ;

Consequently, George W. Morgan, David Clark and James G. Alnutt, having received the highest number of votes, are duly elected.

Mr. Miles, from a select committee, reported favorably on the following bill :

A bill entitled, An act to amend the 65th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, by repealing the 42d, 43d, 44th, 45th and 46th sections of the said Article, and by adding thereto certain sections prohibiting manumission of negro slaves, and authorizing free negroes to renounce their freedom and become slaves ;

Which was read the second time.

The Senate adjourned until half-past 7 o'clock, P. M.
