On motion of Mr. McKaig,

Ordered, That the Secretary be allowed the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, and extra mileage, for the time he may have to remain after the close of the session, and that the Committee on Claims be instructed to pay the same.

On motion of Mr. Franklin,

Ordered, That the Sergeant-at-Arms be allowed the extra sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for his faithful and diligent services during the present session, and John M. Brewer fifty dollars extra, as Reading Clerk.

At half-past 11 o'clock the President made the following reply to the resolutions passed by the Senate :

Senators:—A few brief moments more, and our official association will terminate by Constitutional limitation. I am urged, therefore, not only by a profound respect for propriety, but also by the sincerest emotions of a grateful heart, to acknowledge my obligations and return my thanks, to those over whom I have had the honor to preside during the present session of our Legislature.

When I accepted the position which I now occupy, I did so with great mistrust of my ability to discharge the duties thereof to the satisfaction of the Senate, or with credit to myself. The resolutions just read by the Secretary, however, assure me that I have succeeded in winning the approbation of my associates; and the kind and courteous language in which they are couched, permits me to conclude (without manifestation of vanity, on my part,) that I retire with their respect and esteem.
