

So the Senate denied the leave.

On motion of Mr. Kimmel,

Leave was granted Messrs. Kimmel, Heckart and Stone, to introduce a bill to incorporate a Company to build a turnpike road from Liberty Town, in Frederick county, to intersect the Woodsboro' and Frederick turnpike road at or near the Monocacy bridge.
