

RESOLUTION—

Returning thanks to William T. Jones, Esq., Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, 1004.

Joint resolutions instructing our representatives in Congress to favor an appropriation by Congress to compensate the people of the State for their slaves, when they are emancipated, 897; indefinitely postponed, 898.

Joint resolutions recommending the Fire Escape apparatus of Thomas Thompson, considered, 900; passed, 1006.

Joint resolutions relating to soldiers voting, read and rejected, 903; reconsidered, considered and passed, 904.

In relation to the burning of coupons, read the second time and passed, 990.

Joint resolutions appropriating one thousand dollars, to be used by the Governor in order to publish in pamphlet form or otherwise, a statement showing the resources of Maryland, cheap lands, want of labor, high prices paid for labor, &c., read the first time, 877; read the second time and rejected, 950.

Joint resolution appropriating one thousand dollars, to be used by the Adjutant General, who is authorized to employ recruiting officers to visit the District of Columbia and other places, in order to secure volunteers and fill up the quota of Maryland, read the first time, 878; read the second time and rejected, 950.

Joint resolutions relating to the recruiting and enlistment of fugitive slaves from Maryland, read the second time and rejected, 896.

Of Senate, tendering thanks to Capt. Jno. Rodgers and Capt. A. H. Kelly, read first time and referred, 543; reported favorably on, 558; read the second time and passed, 899.

Granting to Simon T. Martinett free use of the library, read first time, read the second time and passed, 613, 614.
