Your committee deem it advisable, in the full discharge of their duty, to report, in addition to the above, that the returns from Prince George's county show that the polls were not opened in the eighth election district (Aquasco) of that county, and that no election was held, "in consequence of the poll books not being received at said polls until about twenty minutes to ten o'clock, A. M." Your committee, however, have ascertained that the number of votes usually polled at Aquasco does not exceed one hundred and sixty, and whereas the returns show, that the candidate who had the smallest number of votes of any of those declared to be elected, had a majority of three hundred and twenty-seven votes over Mr. Bowie, who had a larger number of votes than any of the defeated candidates, the result of the election would not have been different, even if all the full vote of Aquasco had been polled against the members returned.
