Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled, "An Act to add a new section to article 26, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to 'Corporations,' so as to provide a more summary remedy against companies incorporated by the State to transport persons or property for hire."

Mr. Jones, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported favorably a bill entitled, "An Act to amend and reenact sections 34, 39 and 75 of article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Revenues and Taxes,' and relating to collectors of taxes ;"

Also, favorably a bill entitled. "An Act to amend and reenact section 2 of article 33 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, 'Deaf, Dumb and Blind—education thereof,' and relating to the amount to be paid for said education ;"
