

Which was read and referred to the committee on inspections.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the committee on claims be directed to cause ten suitable lamps to be placed in proper places within the public circle, and to provide for lighting the same during the session of the Legislature, and that the cost thereof be paid out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time and rejected.

On motion of Mr. Hopewell,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled an act to incorporate the Leonard Town Steam Mill Manufacturing Company;

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

Mr. Brown, chairman of the select committee, reported a bill, entitled an act for the establishment of a civil municipal jurisdiction over part of Anne Arundel county, and to alter and change the constitution of this State, so far as may be necessary to effect the same,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Parran,

The house adjourned until to morrow morning ten o'clock.

SATURDAY, January 20th, 1838.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act, to incorporate the Leonard Town steam mill manufacturing company;

And the bill, entitled, an act, to divorce Eliza Harding of Dorchester county, from her husband, Matthew Harding;

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Shower presented a petition of the trustees of Deer Park academy, and others, praying for a donation from the State to said academy;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Shower also presented a petition of Doctor John Rose, and others, of Carroll-county, praying the passage of an act authorising the Botanical or Thompsonian system of medical practice, to be used and administered by persons not members of the Medical Faculty, or exempting the practitioners thereof from the penalties and disabilities provided by the acts of Assembly, aforesaid;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Comegys reported a bill, entitled, an act, to prevent the destruction of wild fowl, in the head waters of the Chesapeake Bay, in the several counties therein mentioned;

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time;
