Mr. Geyer, chairman of the select committee, reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act relating to charges for transportation upon the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, passed at December session, 1836, ch. 261;

Mr. Risteau, chairman of the committee on divorces, reported a bill, entitled, an act to divorce Sirena Upton, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Levi Upton;

Mr. Roberts reported a bill, entitled, an act for the encouragement of agriculture and manufactures, and

Mr. Mann reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the building of an Arsenal in Hagerstown, Washington county,
