

WEDNESDAY, February 7th, 1838.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution, directing the Armorer at Annapolis to contract for the making of two hundred pistol cartridge boxes, and two hundred pair of Holsters, for the use of the cavalry of this State;

Was sent to the senate.

Mr. Rentch presented a petition of Henry Shafer, George Shafer, and H. J. Shafer, praying for an extension of time for the drawing of the Lottery, which was granted them at December session, 1834;

Which was read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Goldsborough presented a petition of Howard Lodge, No. 28, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, at East New Market, in Dorchester county, praying for an act of incorporation;

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. McDaniel presented a memorial of John C. Turner, and Sarah A. Turner, guardians to Jannet R. Turner, and Edward J. Turner, praying the passage of an act for the condemnation of a certain piece of land for the use of a tail race, to a certain mill therein mentioned;

Mr. McDaniel, also presented a memorial of Sarah Brown, counter to the memorial of John C. Turner and Sarah H. Turner, guardian to Jannet R. Turner, and Edward J. Turner, praying for the condemnation of a certain piece of land, for the use of a tail race, to a certain mill therein mentioned;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. Kerr,

Leave was given the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to bring in a bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this Province, and limiting the extent of them.

Mr. Goldsborough from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, delivered the following report:
