

So the bill was passed and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Williams,

The house took up for consideration the resolutions from the senate relative to the establishment of a National Foundry;

The said resolutions were then read the second time by special order;

Mr. Simmons moved to lay said resolutions on the table;

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Alexander moved to lay said resolutions on the table;

Resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to condemn and make public "Cemetery Avenue," as now opened in the city of Baltimore;

Also, the bill entitled a supplement to an act, to establish State Warehouses, in the city of Baltimore;

And, the bill, entitled, an act to confer certain powers over the lot of ground therein mentioned, upon James H. McCulloh, of the city of Baltimore;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severall ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States' Road, within the limits of the State of Maryland; endorsed "will pass, with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were severally read—and

On motion of Mr. Blocher, referred to the committee that originally reported said bill.

And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act to divorce Horatio R. Merryman, of the State of Maryland, from his wife Sarah A. Merryman;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

And the following message:

By the Senate,

February 8, 1838.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We respectfully request your honorable body to return the preamble and resolutions relating to the establishment of a national foundry at Havre-de-Grace in this State, which were passed by the senate and sent to you this day. The senate desire to give to said resolutions further consideration.

Which was read;

The house then proceeded by ballot, to the election of directors on the part of the State, in the several banks wherein the State, as a stockholder, is entitled to directors, in conformity with arrangements made with the senate for that purpose, and the ballots of the members being collected in the ballot box, it was sealed up and
