

MONDAY, February 12th, 1838,

The House met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Hope Butler, a free man of colour,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Baltimore county to build a bridge over the Great Falls of Gunpowder, where the county road leading from Middletown to the Falls road crosses said falls in Baltimore county,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Daniel H. Schleigh, of Washington county, an insolvent debtor,

Also, The bill, entitled, an act directing that the rules of the several courts in this State be published for the information of the people,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of John Cleppinger, of Washington county,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Superannuated Fund Society of the Maryland Annual Conference,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to make valid the election of Jonathan Rinehart, as a county commissioner of Allegany county,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise Robert W. Harper, of Prince George's county, to carry with him to the State of Mississippi, a certain negro, who is a slave for a term of years,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of John Beard, jr. collector of the tax for the first collection district in Anne Arundel county,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the condemnation of a lot of ground for a public landing in St. Mary's county,

And the message adopted by the house on Saturday, in relation to the bill to incorporate The Hereford Academy, in Baltimore county, Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to divorce Julia Ann Gordy, of Worcester county, from her husband William Quinton Gordy,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Law Buildings Company of Baltimore,

And the resolutions relative to the establishment of a National Foundry,

Were returned to the senate.

Mr. Witmer presented two petitions signed by David Kemp, Joshua Doup, and sundry other citizens of Frederick county, praying that the law incorporating The Medical Faculty of Maryland, may be repealed;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Parker presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the passage of an act to prevent Horse Racing in the public roads of said county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Parker, Evans and Simpers.

Mr. Townsend presented a petition of sundry citizens of Salisbury and its vicinity, counter to a petition to repeal a law passed at December session 1835, requiring a recommendation to obtain a license,
