

Also, the resolution directing the Armorer at Annapolis, to contract for the making of two hundred pistol cartridge boxes, and two hundred pair holsters, and for the payment of the same.

Also, the resolution in favor of Capt. James C. Ninde, of the city of Baltimore, making a requisition on the Adjutant General for certain arms and implements.

And the resolution in favor of the members of the Council to the Governor;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and the resolutions ordered to be engrossed.

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of Edward L. Nicholson, and others, devisees and legatees of Richard Harwood, of Thomas, deceased;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise John Lammott, former collector in the third collection district in Baltimore county, to complete his collection;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Shower, Ely, and Turner, of Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Berret, the house took up for consideration the favorable report submitted by Mr. Carroll, chairman of the committee on education, on yesterday in relation to Springfield Academy.

The said report was then read the second time by special order, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Carpinter, chairman of the committee on corporations, delivered the following report;

The committee on corporations to whom was referred the petition of sundry citizens of the town Cumberland, praying the repeal of the act of Assembly, incorporating said Town. Also the petition of sundry citizens of the said Town of Cumberland, counter to the petition praying as aforesaid, ask leave respectfully to

REPORT:

That they have had the subject matter embraced in the said petitions under consideration, and are of opinion that granting the prayer of the petitioners, would be prejudicial to the interests and good government of the said Town of Cumberland, and if the powers vested in the Mayor and Common Council of said Town, have been improperly or injuriously exercised, the citizens of the said Town have their remedy through the medium of the ballot box.

Your committee therefore ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject, and that the petitioners have leave to withdraw their petitions.
