THURSDAY, March 8th, 1838.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday.  
The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act for the distribution of school moneys, and the encouragement of schools and teachers in Harford county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise Jane Hutton, and Margaret Hutton, of the city of Baltimore, to hold, inherit and dispose of real estate, and to be appointed executrixes, administratrixes or guardians;

Also, the preamble and resolution in favour of the securities of Marcy Fountain;

Also, the message and resolutions from the senate, declaratory of the rights of the citizens of this State over their fugitive slaves,

And the bill from the senate, entitled, an act authorising John McHenry, of Allegany county, to erect gates on certain public roads passing through his lands in said county,

Were sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Carroll, the house suspended the rule, and took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of George A. Dashiell, deceased, of Somerset county.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Risteau, the house suspended the rule, and took up for consideration the resolution submitted by Mr. Carroll, chairman of the committee on education, on the 19th Feb. in favour of St. James' Academy, in Baltimore county,—and the amendments proposed thereto.

The amendments having been read the second time were assented to.

The said resolution was then read the second time as amended, assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Hillen presented a petition of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act, giving to mechanics and others, a lien upon buildings for work done and materials furnished for the erection of the same,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hillen, Gallagher and Giles.
