So the amendment was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Blocher, said bill was further amended by striking out the 9th section, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

“And be it enacted, that if hereafter the legislature shall be satisfied that the provisions of this bill shall have been violated by said company, its officers or agents, or that the said charter or any of its provisions, are injurious to the citizens of this State, the legislature hereby reserves the right to repeal or modify the same at any time.”
