

Severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally assented to and the bills ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of tax of Carroll county, to levy a sum of money for the support of Catharine Hipsley, an indigent lunatic, wife of Jonah Hipsley, and Ignatius Syford, an indigent invalid;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Joseph Steele, and others;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act authorising and directing the commissioners of Harford county, to examine into and determine the utility of opening an old road in said county—endorsed, "will not pass;"

Also, the resolutions relative to the loan negotiated by virtue of the act of Dec. session 1835, for the promotion of internal improvement—endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered a petition of Jos. Graham, late sheriff of Talbot county, praying further time to complete his collections—endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of delegates;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. Risteau, (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) the house reconsidered their vote upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland and New York Iron and Coal Company.

On motion of Mr. Risteau, said bill was laid on the table.

Mr. Berret presented two petitions signed by two hundred and twenty-three voters of Carroll county, praying that the commissioners of said county may be elected by the people,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Berret, Powder, and Shower.

Mr. Wilmer presented a petition of the trustees of the poor of Queen Anne's county, and of primary school district No. 22, praying for the passage of a law directing the commissioners of the school fund of said county, to pay over to the trustees of the aforesaid district No. 22, such sum as will be necessary to educate the poor children from the alms house, in addition to their regular dividend,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Wilmer, Harrison, and Roberts.

Mr. Coombs presented a petition of Samuel Barron, Richard L. Thompson, Leonard H. Early and others, praying that Jane Duvall may be placed on the pension roll of Prince George's county,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.
