

as the case may be, shall state in writing the points and questions by them decided; and that in all cases of appeal hereafter taken from any decision of the county courts or the court of chancery, in common law or in equity causes, no question or point shall be made or argued in the court of appeals, except that or those which shall have been decided and determined by the court from whose decision the appeal is made.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That any thing contained in any former act or acts, repugnant to or inconsistent with the provisions of the present act, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Mr. Geyer presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying that a law may be passed, authorising the levy court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money for the purpose of building a bridge over Monocacy, at Devilbiss' tording place,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Geyer, Ent, and Cramer.

On motion of Causin, the house took up for consideration the unfavorable report of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, upon the order of the house to enquire into the expediency of placing Esther Turner Burroughs, of St. Mary's county, upon the pension roll.

Mr. Causin then offered as a substitute for said report the following:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised to pay to Esther T. Burroughs, widow of Norman Burroughs, a soldier in the revolutionary war, a sum of money annually, equal to the half pay of a common soldier, for the life of the said Esther T. Burroughs.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time;

On the question being put—will the house adopt the substitute?

It was Resolved in the affirmative.
