So the amendment was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Giles, said bill was further amended by striking out in the 1st section these words, "for and during the term which he or they shall preside as judges," and inserting in lieu thereof "under the constitution or laws of this State."

The said bill having been read through as amended,

On motion of Mr. Causin, the house was called and the doorkeeper sent for the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Berrett, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the doorkeeper.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to provide for the instruction of indigent blind persons, inhabitants of this State;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to the charter of the Tide Water Canal Company—severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of George A. Dashiell, deceased, of Somerset county—endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution relating to Cokesbury Academy, in Harford county—endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the senate, viz:

A bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Mount St. Mary's College,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Geyer, Biser and Cramer.

A bill, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned, and for other purposes,

Which was read the first time, and

On motion of Mr. McDaniel, read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the senate;

And a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of William Brown, late of Carroll county, deceased,

Which was read the first, and
