Mr. Boyle, of Carroll, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to alter and change the lines of the ninth election district of Carroll county;

Mr. Causin, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Mann, entitled, an act for the benefit of Jane Hillerd, of Washington county,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Selby reported a bill, entitled, an act to alter the place of holding elections in the fourth or Berlin district in Worcester county.

Mr. Huddleson reported a bill, entitled, an act to secure to citizens of Allegany county, the right of trial for debt under warrant in the election district only in which the party so sued may reside.

Mr. Giles reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act relating to the removal of causes for trial within the sixth district, passed at November session 1820, ch. 158.

Mr. Beam reported a bill, entitled, an act to compensate the crier of Montgomery county court.

Mr. Hillen reported a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of the Trustees of the Catholic Cathedral Church of Baltimore.

Mr. Bowie, from the select committee, reported a bill, entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco in Prince Georges county;

And Mr. White reported a bill, entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a weighmaster of live stock in the city of Baltimore;

Which said bills were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Kerr, the house took up for consideration the report and resolutions submitted by him as chairman of the joint committee on the library, on the 30th of January last.

The said report was then read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolutions therein contained assented to.

The doorkeeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the order of the day, being the report submitted by Mr. Sprigg, chairman of the select committee on the currency, and the substitute offered therefor by Mr. Williams, being a bill, entitled, an act for the better regulation of monied corporations.

On the question being put—will the house adopt said substitute?
