

They were severally read the second time.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to compensate Robert B. A. Tate, for extra services as clerk of the levy court of Queen Anne's county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wright, Goldsborough and Hambleton.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe and extend their jurisdiction, so far as it relates to Anne Arundel county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Beckett and Ricaud.

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Mary Jane Staylor of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Robert Galloway,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on divorces.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of the children of John Murray, late of Baltimore county, deceased, and to confirm certain proceedings therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass."

The following message, from His Excellency, Governor Veazey, was communicated by the hands of Thomas Culbreth, Esquire, Clerk of the Council,

It was read, and with the accompanying document, ordered to lie on the table, and

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

600 copies of the document were ordered to be printed for the use of the General Assembly.
