

teries will be discontinued, in obedience to a recent provision of the constitution.

The managers have received in pursuance of Res. No. 93, of 1833, passed 14th March, 1834, the sum of \$19 775 32.

The committee will of course see that, any additional charge upon the revenue from lotteries in behalf of the Monument, must to its extent, be a charge upon the \$12,000 reserved for the State by chapter 125 o 1824, and will therefore affect the general means of the Treasury just as much as if it were made payable out of the dividends of the State's Bank Stock—and exactly to the extent that it will accelerate the completion of the Monument, will it deprive the Treasury of the aid it now receives from lotteries, earlier than is already provided by the mandate of the constitution, referred to.

I do not show these consequences, as objections to the measure submitted by the Senate to the consideration of the committee, but simply to apprise the committee that they will ensue its adoption.

Looking I believe, to the proximate relief of the \$12,000 from the late charge in behalf of the University, the General Assembly of 1835, by Res. No. 75, granted to the Maryland Hospital \$15,000—of which \$10,000 remain to be paid—one half this year, and the residue in the next.
