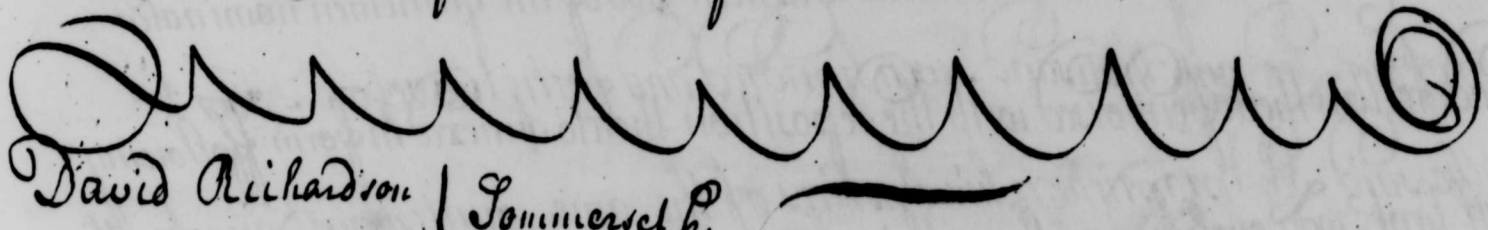

John Evans aged Sixty Years or thereabouts being Sworn saith that about Thirty Years agoe as he came from Mr Francis with some Smiths work he Overtook Mr. Hamblin and after some discourse he askt Mr Hamblin where he was going and he said to Look after his Cattle and Tould this deponent that he had given his Land to his Son and that he thought he had given him a good Gift for Mr. Nutter had offered him Three score pounds for it and they being in the Road the aforesaid Hamblin pointed to the boulder and tould this deponent that there was the uppermost boulder of the Land that he bought of this deponents father and he thinks the quantity was Three hundred acres but he cannot be certain this deponent further saith that he was carried by the Coroner on the aforesaid Land and William Lunny shewd him the same boulder and tould him that it was the upper boulder of Hamblin's Land which place he thinks to be about Two pole to the Southward of the Stake mentioned in Mr Francis's Deposition to the best of his Remembrance and further saith not. John Evans --

William Bodley aged fifty one years being Sworn on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God saith that about sixteen years agoe he did see a post standing about one pole to the westward of the stake mentioned in Mr Francis's Deposition and that sometime afterwards he saw it lying on the ground about Sixty yards to the westward of the aforesaid place and that he had heard Old Mr. Nutter say that he had only put down that post as a blind untill he had secured some Land and further this Deponent saith not.
