All invalid soldiers mustered on invalid transfer relie by Surgeons in charge of General Hospitals; and all men of the 2d battalion companies who can be spared from the Hospital, and who have so far recovered from their wounds or disease as to be thought fit for duty in the 1st battalion, will be sent to the invalid camp or depot nearest to the Hospital; and they will be there examined by a board, consisting of a field officer of the Invalid Corps and a medical officer of the Regular or Volunteer service, who shall have power to confirm their transfer to the corps, and to decide to which battalion they shall be assigned; to send those judged fit for field duty to their regiments, and to discharge those whose infirmities unfit them for duty.
