His services during the War of Eighteen Hundred and Twelve, upon which my claim of eligibility to membership is based, were as follows:

*He was a member of the Baltimore Independent Blues
 Captain Aaron R. Levering, Commanding, 5th Regiment -
 Commanded by Colonel Joseph Storratt, 3rd Brigade
 Commanded by Brigadier General John Stricker
 He was in the Battle of North Point on September 12th 1814
 (Also in the battle of Bladensburg) Under Command
 of the officers herein before named (Maryland Militia)
 The Companies of Captains Levering and Howard
 (My Father being in the former) to the Number of 150
 Composed an advance guard who went forward to
 punish the insolence of the British at Gortsuek's farm
 and attacked the main body of the enemy at that
 place where Major Heath had his horse shot from
 under him and received a contusion in the head
 from a musket-ball from the enemy*
