Was taken prisoner, and carried to the Barbadoes Islands, and remained until released by the close of Hostilities (Maryland Militia)

My Father, Francis A. Miller, was also employed at making cartridges, and was on Battle-field, when his Father Andrew Miller was being carried away in the English vessels.

I declare upon honor, that if admitted to membership in this Society, I will endeavor to promote the purposes of its Institution, and will observe and comply with its Constitution, Rules and Regulations.
