Nathaniel Kimberly was a private in the Washington Blues Capt Geo H Stewart 5th Infantry Regiment, Maryland Militia Lieut Col Joseph Stennett. This Regiment served at North Point and Fort Mc Henry September 12 1814 and was specially mentioned by the commanding General General Samuel Smith, in his report of the engagement to the War Department. Was also engaged at the Battle of Bladensburg Md.

I declare upon honor, that if admitted to membership in this Society, I will endeavor to promote the purposes of its Institution, and will observe and comply with its Constitution, Rules and Regulations.

In 1883 was appointed a Deputy Collector of Int Revenue under Collector John Henry Sellman with headquarters in Washington DC
In 1889 graduated from the University of Maryland School of Medicine and received degree of Doctor of Medicine.
Is Registrar of the Society of War 1872 in Maryland and one of its charter members.
Is Master of Mount Vernon Lodge AOWW and Representative in the Grand Lodge also Medical Examiner of Same.
Is a member of the Board of Managers of the Sons of the American Revolution.
In 1882 married Florence May Hough have had no issue.
The Kimberly progenitors were Colonists that came from England about 1623 and settled in Connecticut (New Haven) the first white child born in the colony was a Kimberly.
On April 14th 94 at a meeting of the National Convention in the old Senate chamber in Independence Hall Philadelphia Pa was elected Registrar General of the General
