His services during the War of Eighteen Hundred and Twelve, upon which my claim of eligibility to membership is based, were as follows:†

John Wright served in the War of 1812 as Second Corporal in the Franklin Artillery attached to the First Regiment of Artillery Maryland Militia Commanded by Lieutenant Colonel David Harris. His Company was under command of Captain John Myers. He was present at the battle of North Point September 12th 1814, in defence of Baltimore City and served till end of the war.

Was injured by explosion of a cannon becoming totally deaf, for which United States Government granted a pension some years later. He was a prominent member of the Society of "Old Defenders War 1812-14"

I declare upon honor, that if admitted to membership in this Society, I will endeavor to promote the purposes of its Institution, and will observe and comply with its Constitution, Rules and Regulations.
