Gov. Samuel Ogle appoints "--my trusty and loving friends Benjamin Tasker of the city of Annapolis, Esq., and Onorio Razolini of the said city, merchant, and each of them jointly and severally my true and lawful attorneys for me in my name and to my use--"

Gift Collection G-99 Letter from Razolini in Italy to Charles Carroll of Annapolis in England, dated 10/17/1757

"----I am glad that Miss Brook that was, is now Mrs. Carroll and beg of you to wish joy from us, as we wish you the same. If you remember I told you that your son would answer all your expectations, which is the greatest satisfaction you can have and hope he will continue to behave to your content, and to his honour.----"

"---Dined with old Squ'r Carrol of anopolis (identified in footnote as Charles Carroll of Annapolis)---he has no family, only a b. son who he intends to make his sole heir.----"

"---all my estate---not herein before bequeathed---I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Carroll by my late wife Elizabeth Brooke the daughter of Clement Brooke, Esq.----"

I don't know when Razolini left Annapolis but I thought that since he was here at least five years after the birth of Charles Carroll of Carrollton it was strange that in 1757 he should be congratulating C.C. of Annapolis on his marriage.

At the time the French traveller was in Annapolis Elizabeth Brooke Carroll had been dead four years. His entry regarding "Squ'r Carroll" was made in July 1765 so C.C. OF C. was in Maryland, having returned to Annapolis in February of that year.

I sure will be interested in learning what you dig up.
