Bought lot in AA 1769 and began ^{improving} house but was forced to sell the lot + unfinished bldg to Ed. Lloyd 1771. Also sold 559 ac. DO. + ca. 500 ac. FR. Began selling FR land heavily in 1779 including land patented of Johnson. Invested in AA land in 1780 w/ J.T. Chase and in 1781 began buying Confiscated Property, w/ notes secured by J.T. Chase + Allen Quynn. By the mid-1780's Chase was in severe financial difficulties and mortgaged the land got by confiscation plus ^{3500 acres} additional land in AA to Chase + Quynn. He also sold over 1100 acres AA to pay debt to John Seale Berelley, his share of the land bought w/ J.T. Chase to pay debts to him and over 500 acres of AA land to pay Quynn (and secure further credit for him) upon a petition by Chase in 1787, the State agreed to void his purchases of the Conf. Prop. and in 1795 Chase + Quynn released the mortgage. By mid 1780's Chase had acquired land in BC and for the next ten years continued to sell FR land while concentrating on developing BC holding. He sold some 40 lots + leased at least 23 between 1801-1810. Shortly before his death he conveyed at least 15 lots to sons + 21 ac. to J.T. Chase.
