

Governor Nice's Right Eye Is Removed

BALTIMORE, June 21. — Gov. Harry W. Nice's right eye was removed today in an operation performed by Dr. L. J. Goldbach in the Wilmer Clinic of the Johns Hopkins Hospital.

Dr. Goldbach said later conditions surrounding the operation and the Governor's reaction to it were "perfect." He indicated, however, that it will be necessary to watch the executive's condition closely for the next few days for possible unexpected developments.

Governor Nice, under a local anaesthetic only, was conscious throughout the period—less than an hour—he was in the operating room.

He entered the hospital a week ago to rest preparatory to having the eye removed, and Dr. Goldbach ordered today that he remain absolutely quiet and see no visitors other than Mrs. Nice for the next few days.

The Governor injured his eye prior to his election two years ago.
