## Scheduled Tomorrow

Mayor-elect Theodore R. McKeldin will take the oath of office at noon tomorrow, just twenty years and three days after his first inaugural.

The oath will be administered to Mr. McKeldin by James F. Carney, clerk of the Superior Court, in elaborate ceremonies at War Memorial Plaza.

Mr. McKeldin, the only Republican to serve as Mayor since 1931, has two terms as Governor since his first inaugural in 1943.

Hyman A. Pressman, comptroller-elect, Democrat who was elected on a fusion ticket with Mr. McKeldin, will be sworn in by the new Mayor.

Odell Smith, representing Governor Tawes, who is in Europe, and the outgoing Mayor, Philip H. Goodman, who is retiring to private life, and Mrs. Goodman, head the official party of invited guests.

The official party also will include Thomas D'Alesandro 3d, president and president-elect of the City Council, and Mrs. D'Alesandro, and Dr. R. Walter Graham, retiring city comptroller, and Mrs. Graham.

Mr. D'Alesandro, a Democrat elected to a full term in the May 7 election, will take the oath of office when the new City Council is sworn in Thursday.

Clarence R. Zarfoss, chairman of the inaugural committee, said 1,000 seats will be available for the public at War Memorial Plaza. There will be no reserved seats.

### Official Program

The official program will get under way at 11 A.M., an hour before the inaugural, with a concert by the Municipal Band under the direction of Leigh Martinet, conductor.

Following the processional and the playing of the National Anthem, the Most Rev. Lawrence J. Shehan, D.D., Archbishop of Baltimore, will deliver the invocation.

Mr. McKeldin will deliver his inaugural address after he is sworn in by Mr. Carney.

The address will be followed by a prayer by Rabbi Morris Lieberman and the presentation of the City Hall flag by Mr. Zarfoss.

Mr. McKeldin will then administer the oath of office to Mr. Pressman.

### Reception Follows

Bishop Edgar A. Love will deliver the benediction, ending the ceremonies. A reception will follow at the Mayor's office.

Other members of the official party include Chief Judge Simon E. Sobeloff, of the United States Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals; Chief Judge Roszel C. Thomsen, of the Federal District Court for Maryland, and other members of the court; Chief Judge Michael J. Manley, of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, and other members of the court.

Also, Senators J. Glenn Beall and Daniel B. Brewster; members of Maryland's congressional delegation, and other city and State officials, including former Mayor Thomas D'Alesandro, Jr.
