## 5 SPECIAL DEGREES

### Doctor Of Laws Conferred At Commencement Exercises Sun

Governor McKeldin; long since a bachelor of laws, has received five honorary degrees as doctor of laws in the short space of nine days.

Three were granted by Maryland colleges and universities, two by out-of-State colleges. His nine-day record:

Washington College, Chestertown, June 3; Morgan State College, June 4; University of Maryland, June 9; Beaver College, Jenkintown, Pa., June 10, and Hanover College, Hanover, Ind., June 11.

Two years ago he received his first honorary degree of doctor of laws. That was at Rider College, Trenton, N.J.

#### Other Attendances

His commencement attendance this year has not been confined to degree-receiving occasions—or to colleges. Today he will attend exercises at the William Fell School No 6, Ann street.

He is scheduled to participate in graduation ceremonies tonight at the North Harford High School, Pylesville, Harford county, and tomorrow night at the Wiley H. Bates High School, Annapolis.

He also spoke at commencement exercises at Charlotte Hall Military Academy, St. Mary's county; Frostburg State Teachers College and Towson State Teachers College.

The Governor received his law degree from the University of Maryland.
