# Governor's relation in mishap

## *in Eastport*

Gov. Marvin Mandel's 18-  
year-old stepdaughter, Helen  
M. Dorsey, was involved in a  
single car accident early  
Sunday morning when the  
vehicle she was driving  
swerved off Old Annapolis  
Road in Round Bay, struck a  
fence and landed in a gully,  
county police say.

Miss Dorsey, whose address  
was listed in the police report  
as the Governor's Mansion, and  
a passenger, Marie C.  
Holthaus, 16, 417 Bens Oak  
Drive, were both treated and  
released from Anne Arundel  
General Hospital after the 2:45  
a.m. accident, police say.

County police officer Don Lee  
gave the following account of  
the accident:

Miss Dorsey, driving a 1971  
Chevrolet station wagon owned  
by her mother, Jeanne Mandel,  
was in the northbound lane of  
Old Annapolis Road about 400  
feet from Round Bay Road  
when she spotted a dog in the  
middle of the road.

To avoid hitting the animal,  
Miss Dorsey crossed the middle  
line, failed to negotiate a bend  
in the road and ramméd into a  
fence next to the southbound  
lane.

The car continued moving  
until it hit a tree and crashed  
down the side of a small en-  
bankment. After striking the  
tree, the engine caught fire for  
a few seconds. The car was  
destroyed in the accident.

When Lee arrived at the  
scene of the accident, he said  
the "occupants showed no sign  
of physical injury, but they  
were in a state of shock."

The two women were trans-  
ported to the hospital in an  
ambulance, police say.
