

Reverdy Johnson's Portrait:

A handsome oil portrait of the late Reverdy Johnson, the distinguished Maryland jurist, was hung in the Superior Courtroom in the new Courthouse in Baltimore today. The portrait is said to be an excellent likeness of Mr. Johnson. It was painted from a photograph in 1875 by Mr. J. B. Flagg, a New York artist, and was presented recently by Mr. Johnson's son, Mr. Reverdy Johnson, to the Baltimore Bar Library Company upon the condition that it should be hung in the courthouse. It is life size and represents a three-quarter length profile view of Mr. Johnson seated in a chair. Reverdy Johnson was born in Annapolis in the house now occupied by Hon. John Wirt Randall. One of his nephews, James Johnson resides on North West street. Another nephew residing here is Charles Johnson, agent of the United States Express Company, George Johnson, a third nephew formerly of Annapolis, now resides in Washington.
