

# LAY CONCRETE AT MANSION GROUNDS

**Governor Nice And Family  
Move To Baltimore Dur-  
ing Repair Period.**

Workmen today began pouring concrete for the footings of the new northeast wing of the Executive Mansion in which the offices of the Governor will be located.

Gov. Harry W. Nice and his family have turned the mansion over to the workmen, who were busy today under the personal supervision of Clyde N. Fritz, architect, who prepared the plans for changing the present mansion into one of Colonial design, with two wings.

The rugs and furniture of the mansion were being packed for re-finishing and cleaning, while the building operations are underway. Fritz said it would take from 4 to 5 months to complete the work.

While concrete was going in the foundations for the northeast wing, workmen were excavating for footing for the southeast wing, and were removing a wooden porch which opened off the parlor.

This wing will contain a conservatory with a workroom for the gardener underneath. It was at first proposed to build a State ball-room in the wing, but it was found that it would be too small.
