

Affairs in Talbot County.—We copy the following from the Eastern Star:

Sentenced.—On Saturday evening Judge Wicks sentenced the following negroes convicted of crime at the late session of the Circuit Court for Talbot county: Richard Mowney, to four years' confinement in the penitentiary, for stealing a horse; George Sutton, to one year's confinement in the penitentiary, for stealing wheat; Thos. Nelson, two years' confinement in the penitentiary for stealing chickens; and Eli Fisher, convicted of murder in the second degree, to sixteen years' confinement in the penitentiary, for the murder of Wm. Holmes, in Caroline county. One of his counsel was ex-Governor Philip Francis Thomas.
