Since then the Grady household has been blessed with two additions.

There just isn't enough room in the 2-story, 3-bedroom, one-bath row house in Northwood to hold all the Gradys. So the thing to do was to find larger quarters.

But all the available houses were either in an unhappy location or were too expensive. But the Goodale Rd. house met the Grady family's needs. Settlement is due in mid-August.

The new location is ideal for the kids, Grady pointed out. Two of them go to Cathedral

School which is moving from Mulberry St. to the new Cathedral.

FOR MRS. GRADY and the children, says the mayor, the difficult part is leaving Northwood neighbors.
