

# Judge O'Dunne Rites Tuesday

Funeral services for Eugene O'Dunne, retired judge of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore who died Friday at Ogunquit, Maine, will be held Tuesday from H. W. Mears and Sons funeral establishment, 800 Calvert street, with a requiem mass at the Cathedral.

Burial will be in New Cathedral Cemetery.

Judge O'Dunne had been ill and almost totally blind since March, 1958. He and Mrs. O'Dunne had

made their home in Ogunquit since late last year.

He was generally considered to be the most colorful judge to have sat on the Supreme Bench. He first caught the public eye in the early 1900's when he was a young political reformer who vigorously attacked the established Democratic machine.

He ran for state's attorney three times—in 1911, 1915 and 1919—only to be licked by the bosses he berated.

The late Gov. Albert C. Ritchie appointed him to the Supreme Bench in 1926, where he was to remain until he reached the statutory retirement age of 70 on June 21, 1945.
