

MISS SZOLD GIVEN BIRTHDAY HONORS

Founder Of Hadassah Praised
By Jews Throughout
World

Dr. Harry Friedenwald
Speaks At Celebration In
Synagogue

At the hour that Jews throughout the world were praising her activities and in other ways observing her seventy-fifth birthday, Miss Henrietta Szold, Baltimore-born Palestinian social worker, yesterday remained at the home of her sister, Mrs. Louis H. Levin, 2104 Chelsea Terrace.

With Mrs. Levin and another sister, Mrs. Thomas Seltzer, of Easton, Conn., and other members of her family, Miss Szold participated in a birthday dinner.

Her Career Reviewed

Meanwhile, Jews throughout the world listened to an international broadcast originating in Palestine that was devoted to extolling Miss Szold and her work.

Leading Zionists reviewed her career in founding Hadassah, a women's organization formed primarily to sponsor and maintain medical and cultural development in Palestine, and praised her efforts to further education and the social services in that country.

Celebration In Synagogue

The Baltimore celebration was held at the Chizuk Amuno Synagogue, where Mrs. Meyer Strauss, president of the local branch of Hadassah, presided.

A laudatory speech was made by Dr. Harry Friedenwald, and a review of Miss Szold's career by Mrs. Emil Crockin, first president of the local branch. Rabbi Adolph Coblenz pronounced the birthday benediction. There was a special musical program under the direction of Cantor Adolph J. Weisgal.

Miss Szold, who arrived here unannounced last week, will remain at Mrs. Levin's home for several weeks before returning to Palestine to begin what she calls her life's work—the removal of Jewish youths from Germany, Lithuania, France, Poland and Russia.
