

Extract from Regulations of the Board of Health to secure a full and correct record of Vital Statistics in the City of Baltimore.

SECTION 2. And be it further enacted and ordained, That whenever any person shall die in the said city, it shall be the duty of the Physician who attended during his or her last sickness, or the Coroner, when the case comes under his notice, to furnish within forty eight hours after the death to the Undertaker or other persons superintending the burial, a Certificate setting forth, as far as the same can be ascertained, the full name, sex, age and condition (whether married or single) of the person deceased, and the cause and date of death, except in cases of births and deaths of illegitimate children.
