

WASHINGTON COLORED LAWYER IN NEW MOVE FOR SNOWDEN'S LIFE

Will Ask Writ Of Habeas Corpus From
United States District Court At
Baltimore Today

And yet another attempt is to be made to save the life of John Snowden, doomed to die Friday morning.

Attorney Charles Williams, a Washington, D. C., lawyer, visited Snowden in his death cell today and left with the signature of the convicted man to an affidavit. He will appear immediately before Judge John C. Rose of the United States district court at Baltimore seeking a writ of habeas corpus.

Williams sets up that Snowden should have been indicted and tried for the crime in Anne Arundel county. Annapolis attorneys following the case are of the opinion that this latest move will avail nothing inasmuch as the court of appeals has repeatedly held that this is not necessary.

Whatever action is taken on the writ is expected to be made known immediately.
